
WASHAUN EALEY EMANUEL CO. INST.

Rams on way to first Region 8-AAAAA crown after win over Brookwood

As the clock was ticking towards triple zeros, the Grayson student body knew what was about to happen. Head football coach Mickey Conn knew what was about to happen. The players, though tired from a hardfought game, knew what was about to happen.

The Brookwood Broncos' stranglehold on Region 8-AAAAA was coming to an end and the Rams were about to give Brookwood its first region loss since 2004, a streak of 29 straight region games. So please forgive the student body for getting a little premature in its celebration of arguably the school's biggest regular-season win in history. The Grayson Rams, after knocking off Brookwood 10-7 and Parkview 24-22, now have the inside track to the Region 8 title. Still, Conn is quick to point out that nothing has been won yet: "We're now getting everybody's best game." That may be true, but Conn's team is meeting all of the challenges and is led by two strong-willed offensive standouts.

LEADING THE WAY ...

Quarterback Tyler Horne had Conn excited entering the season, and the senior has done nothing to temper his enthusiasm thus far.

"Tyler's very capable and we have a quarterback that can win a game," Conn said.

Horne, noted mostly for his quick feet, was forced to pass in a game earlier this year against South Gwinnett and he shredded the Comets through the air en route to a 49-14 win. "We're not going to change the way we prepare [for anyone]," Conn said. "We have a balanced offense with Horne and [Ean] Pemberton, and we think we can win playing our style of football."

Horne has gotten a lot of help from Pemberton this season. The diminutive running back stands only 5-foot-4, but he plays much bigger with a huge heart. Conn says, "He's got tons of talent and he's going to make somebody a heck of a college player someday." In just the past three weeks, Pemberton has averaged 183 yards per game, and two touchdowns against Parkview helped knock off the Panthers. Pemberton toted the ball 39 times that game, but that doesn't seem to faze him.

"We completely controlled the line of scrimmage in the second half," Conn said. "We can do a bunch of things offensively, but we'd rather run the football [with Pemberton]."

As good as Grayson looked entering the Brookwood game, however, the Broncos were still the three-time defending region champs and head coach Mark Crews had his team clicking. The Broncos appeared to have gotten past the team's early losses and Brice Smith was leading a pumped-up offense.

But Grayson's defensive line allowed just seven points to the potent Bronco rushing attack – and Conn wasn't necessarily surprised.

"[The defensive line] has been the biggest surprise of the year," he said. "They play with a lot of heart."

A turnover on special teams allowed Horne to show his quick feet with a touchdown, and a field goal from Austin Clark iced the game for the Rams. Pemberton became the first 100-yard rusher Brookwood had allowed all season; he finished with 140 yards on 27 carries, leading Conn to say, "This kid's unbelievable."

AIMING FOR NO. 1 ...

Grayson may be well on its way to a region title, and while the regular-season title is nice, the home-field advantage it brings delights Conn the most. Last season the Rams' hopes of a state title ended in South Georgia with a 22-7 loss to Camden County, but Conn is hopeful that won't be the case this season.

"We would like to be the No. 1 seed and not have to travel," he said. "We got into trouble at Camden last season. We will just keep fighting and scratching every game to reach the playoffs."

With the team's recent success, the playoffs are all but assured and now the team can focus on advancing back to the Georgia Dome where the Rams kicked off their season with a 31-21 victory over McEachern in the Corky Kell Classic. The key will be for the Rams to keep the momentum rolling with Meadowcreek and Central Gwinnett remaining on the schedule. Win those games, and the Rams will be able to celebrate a perfect region record and that No. 1 seed they wanted entering the season.

"It's been a great building process and we've got great kids," Conn said. "We've built this the right way and these kids play with such heart."

Ealey makes history, Harrison prevails and Tucker wins Region 6-AAAA battle

Washaun Ealey of Emanuel County Institute broke the state career touchdown record on Friday, scoring three times to bring his career total to 113. Ealey, a senior, broke the previous record of 111, which was held by Matt Dunham of Pacelli (2001-04), and brought his single-season touchdown total to 21 (last year he broke the state single-season record for touchdowns with 58). Ealey's scores not only put him alone atop the record books for touchdowns in a career, they helped ECI win a crucial Region 3-A game against then-undefeated Johnson County, 35-12. ECI, the top-ranked team in Class A and defending state champion, moves to 7-0 on the year.

FRIDAY NIGHT REVISITED

Undefeated East Paulding traveled to undefeated Harrison to try and score a program-defining win and put itself in the driver's seat for the Region 5-AAAAA title. But Harrison (7-0, 6-0) reasserted its region dominance, downing the Raiders 28-16. Robbie Godhigh did it all for the Hoyas, returning a kickoff 92 yards for a score, rushing for 103 yards, and playing a solid defensive back. He had to leave the game in the fourth quarter, however, with a sprained ankle.

Tucker knocked off Chamblee last Friday, 20-13. The win puts the Tigers alone in third place in Region 6-AAAA behind Southwest DeKalb and Marist, and drops Chamblee into a four-way tie for fourth place. Incidentally, Chamblee will play the other three teams it is tied with (Forsyth Central, Stone Mountain and Miller Grove) in the last three weeks of the season.... Stephenson defeated M.L. King 27-7 to move into second place in Region 2-AAAAA behind undefeated Union Grove. ... Milton defeated Lassiter 21-10 to move to 5-2 overall and 4-2 in Region 6-AAAAA. Lassiter drops to 4-2 in the region, and for the moment, is out of the playoffs with three games remaining.... Banneker upset our No. 2-ranked team in Class 4A, Mays, by the score of 18-14.... St. Pius X picked up a Region 5-AAA win over Washington on Saturday at Grady Stadium, 35-25.

First-year head coach Chris Parker has achieved a remarkable turnaround at Chapel Hill, having already led the Panthers to a 6-1 record and a 5-1 mark in Region 4-AAAAA. The former Sequoyah assistant has already coached Chapel Hill to its most wins ever in a season, and upset East Coweta last Friday, 13-7.

Indians aim to end Hoyas' undefeated streak Whitaker, No. 3 Dragons battle Coosa

The Harrison Hoyas and McEachern Indians have split their previous two encounters, each in dominating fashion. The Hoyas won last year's game 40-6, while the Indians won the 2006 edition 35-13. Harrison (7-0 overall, 6-0 Region 5-AAAAA) is coming off a sound 28-16 victory over East Paulding, snapping the Raiders' 22-game regular-season win streak in the process. McEachern (3-4, 3-3) will be look-ing to rebound after a deflating loss against North Cobb where the Indians allowed two late touchdowns in a 21-14 loss last Friday.

The Hoyas lost two of their senior two-way players in the East Paulding tilt. Robbie Godhigh had an electrifying two-touchdown night against the Raiders prior to an ankle injury in the fourth quarter. Godhigh ran to his right on a toss and fell awkwardly after being tackled by the back of his jersey. Brad Mears was injured late in the second quarter with a feared MCL tear. With Godhigh playing safety, tailback and kick returner, and Mears being the starter at right guard and linebacker, first-year head coach David Hines will have extra holes to fill. Still, the Hoyas control their own destiny in the region and are on their way to a No. 1 seed for the playoffs.

The Indians are looking to avenge last year's loss to the Hoyas and improve their overall record when they travel to Harrison. An upset against the region's top team on the road would help McEachern forget about last week's tough defeat. Raajan Bennett will need to have a game like he did against the Warriors, where he ran for one of the Indians' scores and threw a touchdown as well.

The Pepperell versus Coosa series in Region 7-AA has been controlled by Pepperell as of late, as the Dragons have won the last two matchups and 17 of the last 20. Still, Pepperell only leads the overall series by one game, 23-22-1. The No. 3-ranked Dragons are unde-feated at 7-0 this season and it will be a

tough task for the Eagles to deal them their first loss. Last week, Coosa edged Armuchee 7-6 to improve its record to 4-3

Armuchee 7-6 to improve its record to 4-3 overall, but Pepperell defeated the same Armuchee team 42-15 on Oct. 3. The Pepperell offense is led by running back Brandon Whitaker, who rushed for 1,576 yards and 21 touchdowns last season. Whitaker had four total touchdowns in the win over Rockmart. The defense is a 4-4 scheme, led by lineman Matthew Kelley and

defensive back Kendric Cheeks, that only allowed 17 yards against Temple on Oct. 10.

The Eagles' Wing T offense depends on two talented running backs: tailback Quentin High and fullback Lebron Neal. Neal had 1,015 yards last season and Hight rushed for 90 yards and two touchdowns against Model on Oct. 3. Coosa's 3-3 defense is led by lineman Blake Lambert and linebackers Fatir Pillow and David Masters. The defense has allowed an average of 11 points per game in the four wins, but nearly 40 points in their three losses to Rockmart, Central-Carroll and Calhoun. The Eagles will have to slow down Whitaker and most importantly keep him out of the end zone to have a chance at the upset.

BERKMAR PATRIOTS

The football team spoiled Homecoming for the Meadowcreek Mustangs, winning a tight contest 10-7 on Oct. 10. Michael Rosser scored Berkmar's only touchdown in the second quarter from eight yards out. Ben Wibonele added a 45-yard field goal in the third period to give Berkmar a lead. The Patriots caught a break late in the fourth quarter as Meadowcreek signal-caller Sean Frezell inexplicably spiked the ball on fourth down deep in Berkmar territory. The Patriots' inconsistent play continued against a red-hot and unbeaten Grayson team in a 28-7 loss Friday night. The offense was stifled most of the evening and was held to 18 yards of total offense. The game was within reach for the Patriots, however, until a second-quarter fumble resulted in a Rams touchdown and 14-0 lead. The lone highlight offensively was a 46-yard scoring strike from Xavier Briggs to Duchein Williams. Berkmar (3-4) will hope the seasonal trend of winning after each loss continues next Friday night when they pay a visit to the Black Knights of Central Gwinnett for a 7:30 p.m. showdown.

BROOKWOOD BRONCOS

A fter tasting defeat in region play for the first time in 29 games on Oct. 10, the football team welcomed Central Gwinnett as it tried to start a new streak. Just one week after allowing its first 100-yard rusher of the season, the Bronco defense allowed Diante Drake to scamper for 101 yards. But the Broncos, thanks to Brice Smith, still won the game 27-14. In the 10-7 loss to Grayson, a special teams breakdown led to the Rams' only touchdown. Senior Brice Smith continued his hot streak, scoring another touchdown. The team hits the road this Friday to take on Dacula. ... The softball team earned a trip to the state sectionals. The Lady Broncos met Mill Creek in the first round of the State Tournament and lost 2-0. In the losr's bracket, the Lady Broncos stayed alive after a 5-1 victory over Walton on Saturday morning. But hours laer, Brookwood fell 2-1 to Kennesaw Mountain, effectively ending the team's season. Brookwood finished with a final record of 14-19-2.

BUFORD WOLVES

It was business as usual for the defending state football champs in their travels to face Cross Keys on Oct. 11, as the team earned a resounding 63-0 victory at Adams Stadium. The long list of players that scored for Buford include Cody Getz, Storm Johnson and Sterling Bell. On the road against Thomson last Friday, defense was the theme, as the Wolves kept the Bulldogs quiet and ineffective all night long in a gritty 29-0 win. This Friday the team hosts Blessed Trinity. ... The softball team claimed its second regional softball championship in school history, going 3-0 in the Region 6-AA tournament. Buford defeated Blessed Trinity 11-0 in five innings to advance to the title game behind Karli Fullem's two-hit, 10-strikeout performance. In the 9-1 title game victory over Greater Atlanta Christian, Fullem added a homer while Lexi Overstreet went 3-3 with three RBIs. Melissa Dickey shut the door on the Spartans, allowing one hit and one unearned run while racking up seven stikeouts. The team won its first two games of the sectionals against Crawford County (8-0) and Jefferson (4-0).

CENTRAL GWINNETT BLACK KNIGHTS

Freshman quarterback Jordan Adams had a big game against Shiloh on Oct 10, leading the Black Knights to a 21-10 victory. Diante Drake was electric once again, piling up 218 yards rushing on 22 carries. Drake also hauled in two touchdowns from Adams in the win. Adams ended the night 9-for-12 passing for 109 yards and the two scoring tosses to Drake. Adams and the Black Knights didn't fare as well in their game with Brookwood last Friday, falling 27-17 to the Broncos. Central kept the game close behind a strong performance from Adams, who went 24 of 32 passing for 225 yards and two touchdowns. Adams also threw three interceptions, the second of which was returned for a touchdown to extend the Bronco lead to 27-14 in the fourth quarter. The Knights tried to muster a late rally, but an interception by Wade Brogdon with eight minutes remaining derailed the comeback effort. Impressively, Adams has completed 75 percent of his passes in two starts. The team's next game will be at home this Friday against the Patriots of Berkmar.

We're getting everybody's best game." That was what head football coach Mickey Conn said following the team's huge 10-7 win over region foe Brookwood on Oct. 10. The win gave Grayson victories over its top two opponents for the Region 8-AAAAA title. Running back Ean Pemberton became the first rusher to gain 100 yards against the Bronco defense this season, as he recorded 139 yards on 26 carries. Quarterback Tyler Horne had the lone Grayson touchdown and kicker Austin Clark's third-quarter field goal turned out to be the winning margin. The Rams avoided a letdown against Berkmar last Friday with a 28-7 win. The team welcomes Meadowcreek this Friday. ... The softball team fought hard but ultimately came up short in a bid for the state sectionals. The team watched Dacula lock up a bid to the sectionals, falling 2-0 to the Falcons.
