Diverse group of teams, star players and styles headline this year's semifinals

It won't be difficult to enjoy the semifinals this year.

Whether it is the high-flying passing attacks of Collins Hill and Chattahoochee or Carrollton's impregnable defense, fans will be awed by the quality of high school football from the very best teams in the Peach State. Meanwhile, Carver-Columbus will unleash one of the best running backs in the nation in Isaiah Crowell, while Tucker will feature a defense that has three BCS conference commitments on it.

We sure do have it good here in Georgia when it comes to homegrown high school football.

HIGH FIVE ...

One of the interesting storylines that jumps out of this year's "final fours" is the trio of Gwinnett powers that made the Class 5A semis. Collins Hill and Grayson each pulled off surprising wins last Friday at Lowndes and Valdosta. What made the upsets even more surprising was that the two squads had to travel to two of the largest and most imposing high school stadiums in the state to pull off victories against two of the most tradition-rich programs in Georgia.

Grayson's win was especially impressive, as the Rams shut out the previously high-scoring Wildcats. Brookwood joins the two in the semis after a shootout win over upstart Hillgrove, who had upset Stephenson and Camden County. And not to be left out, Rush Propst's Colquitt County Packers are back in the semifinals after defeating Mill Creek.

QUAD-ZILLA ...

Class 4A may be one of the toughest classifications to figure out the favorite. Three of the teams are undefeated while Statesboro (11-2) knocked off highly-ranked and undefeated Kell last Friday. Chattahoochee will try to throw the ball effectively with Tim Byerly under center and Kane Whitehurst catching his passes. It will be interesting to see how the Cougars fare against the stout Blue Devil defense, which held Brian Randolph and Kell to just seven points last week.

On the other half of the bracket, mighty Tucker, winners of the 2008 state title, will face fellow unbeaten Starr's Mill. It could be a high-scoring affair, as both teams average more than 30 points per game.

TRIPLE A ...

Like 4A, Class 3A features three unbeaten and no true favorite. Peach County, the defending champion, Sandy Creek, the defending Class 4A champ, and powerful Carrollton all roll into the final four unbeaten.

Burke County, winners of 10 straight, will face Carrollton on one side of the bracket. The host Trojans, featuring Georgia Tech commitment Broderick Snoddy at running back, have dominated most competition this year and shut out previously unbeaten Cairo last weekend.

Meanwhile, Peach County and Sandy Creek will clash in one of the most highly anticipated games of the season. The two defending champions meet to determine who will own the state's longest winning streak in any class.

DOUBLE TROUBLE ...

In a class that was dominated by two teams this season, everyone knows who the favorites are. But will they make it to the final for a rematch? Carver-Columbus and Buford were No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, nearly the entire season. The Tigers won the earlier game in Columbus 14-0 but must get past undefeated and over-looked Calhoun. The Yellow Jackets got over losing last year's quarterback, Nash Nance, and

star wideout, Da'Rick Rogers, to complete an undefeated regular season. If the Jackets can contain Crowell, they may shock the state and reach the finals.

The other titan of 2A, Buford, must defeat Lovett in the other semi in a rematch of a regular season game, which was won by the Wolves 37-14.

A-PLUS ...

The state's smallest classification will not be small on competition Friday, night when two No. 1 seeds meet in one half of the bracket. Clinch County and Wilkinson County will butt heads to see whose winning streak will end. Clinch was never really tested this season until last week, when ELCA pushed the Panthers to the brink in a 34-27 affair.

In the other semifinal, Wesleyan and Savannah Christian square off in a duel between teams who pulled shockers on their way here. Last week, the Wolves upset Nick Marshall and Wilcox County in a convincing 45-28 win. Superstar running back Kyle Karempelis ran for 298 yards and three touchdowns for No. 2 seed Wesleyan.

CLASS AAAAAA SEMIFINALS PREVIEW

Colquitt County at Grayson

A flurry of upsets in Class 5A has formed an unlikely semifinal matchup between a pair of No. 3 seeds in Colquitt County and Grayson. The two teams have combined to earn five of their six postseason victories on the road. Colquitt County toppled Jenkins 50-21, pulled out a 48-47 thriller at M.L. King, then hosted Mill Creek last Friday and prevailed 27-14. Grayson, on the road for all three of its contests, opened with a 31-0 shutout of North Forsyth, edged North Gwinnett 23-19, and most recently blanked Valdosta 22-0.

For a while it looked like Colquitt County might not even qualify for the playoffs. The Packers dropped their first three games of the season to Cook County, South Panola (MS), and Thomas County Central. They went 2-2 in Region 1-AAAAA but tested Valdosta in a 36-29 loss to end the regular season. From there, Colquitt County has not looked back. The offense, led by quarterback Tyler Brown, running back Tevin King, and receiver Tommy Hudson, is as good as there is in Georgia.

Grayson lost its opener to Kell and suffered a pair of setbacks in October, but the Rams are peaking at the right time. Their two playoff shutouts give them four on the season and they have allowed more than 20 points only once in 13 games. This semifinal will feature an intriguing clash between Colquitt's offense and Grayson's defense. The Rams forced Valdosta into six turnovers and will look for more of the same against a Packers offense that gave it away five times against Mill Creek.

Collins Hill at Brookwood

Brookwood is the lone remaining No. 1 seed in Class 5A and the Broncos are set to host Collins Hill in an all-Gwinnett semifinal showdown. The game is a rematch of a regular-season clash on Sept. 3, which Brookwood won 45-38. While they boast a 12-1 record, the Broncos have not taken an easy route to the last four victories. After beating Alpharetta 44-13 in round one, Brookwood then got past Norcross 34-24 and won a back-and-forth shootout over Hillgrove 45-35. The team's only loss of the season came at the hands of Region 8-AAAAA rival Dacula 24-14 way back on Sept. 10.

Collins Hill, the No. 2 seed out of Region 7-AAAAA, is also in the midst of a huge winning streak. The Eagles found themselves at 1-3 after consecutive losses to Brookwood, M.L. King and North Gwinnett, but they have now won nine in a row. Collins Hill booked its spot in the semifinals with close victories over Woodstock (7-3), Roswell (35-24) and Lowndes (31-28 in overtime), the last two of which came on the road.

If their previous meeting and recent playoff games are any indication, another offensive eruption could be in the cards. Brookwood's high-powered attack is led by quarterback Ben McLane and running back Nick Tompkins, while kicker Erick Yang has been clutch in the post-season. The Broncos, though, will have to take care of the football after committing seven turnovers against Hillgrove. For Collins Hill, quarterback Taylor Heinicke is the all-time leading passer in Gwinnett County and he overwhelmed Lowndes with 395 yards and three touchdowns.

Chattahoochee at Statesboro

The undefeated Chattahoochee Cougars (13-0) head to Statesboro Friday night to play the Blue Devils (11-2) for a berth in the state championship game. The Cougars, coming off a 37-14 win over Dutchtown in the Class 4A quarterfinals, are looking for their first perfect season in school history, as well as their first state title.

Head coach Terry Crowder has posted just two winning seasons at Chattahoochee, and 2010 has been the Cougars' best season under the seventh-year coach. Prior to this year the Cougars had not won more than eight games under Coach Crowder.

Five-time state champion Statesboro is looking for its first title since 2005, and its second under current head coach Steve Pennington. The Blue Devils defeated Cobb County powerhouse Kell 17-7 in the quarterfinals, and have not lost since Week 7 when they lost to Evans. Statesboro has been fairly balanced on both sides of the ball this year allowing 17 ppg while scoring 23 ppg. Chattahoochee has been more dominant throughout the season, forcing a region-leading 42 ppg while allowing only 13 ppg.

Chattahoochee and Statesboro entered the playoffs as No. 1 seeds from Region 7-AAAA and Region 2-AAAA respectively. The winner of Friday's game will play the winner of the Tucker/Starr's Mill game. This will be the first ever meeting between the two schools. Score 44 member Matt Kiefer, an offensive lineman, will be on the field for the Cougars. Kiefer has yet to commit to a school.

Starr's Mill at Tucker

Friday night the Tucker Tigers host the Starr's Mill Panthers at Hallford Stadium with a trip to the Georgia Dome and spot in the Class 4A state championship game on the line.

The Tigers (13-0, 10-0) are coming off a dominating 42-3 win over Ware County, and are looking for their second state title in three years. The Tigers are 49-5 in four years under head coach Franklin Stephens, and a win Friday would put them one win away from the first perfect season in school history.

Starr's Mill (13-0, 6-0) is also looking for their first perfect season as well as their first state title. Playing for a new coach for the first time since the Panthers started playing football in 1998, a win Friday night would, at a minimum, secure the best single-season record in school history. Head coach Chad Phillips' boys defeated East Paulding 28-0 in the state quarterfinals.

Friday's game will feature three Tigers who are Score 44 members, a list of the top 44 senior football players in the state. Linebackers James Vaughters and Justin Garrett have been dominant on defense this year, and are a big reason Tucker's defense ranks amongst the best in the state holding opponents to 10 ppg. Vaughters has committed to play for Stanford, while Garrett has committed to Auburn. Defensive back Chris Sanders will be anchoring the secondary and has committed to Georgia. However, the Panthers are no slouches on defense either, holding opponents to an astounding 9 ppg. This will be the first meeting between the two schools.

Peach County at Sandy Creek

The Peach County Trojans own the longest active winning streak in the state, with 28 consecutive victories. After beating their opponents by a combined score of 82-0 in the first two rounds of the playoffs, it took 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to overcome a huge deficit against Grady and keep the winning streak alive. With a 42-35 victory over the Grey Knights, Peach County still has hopes to defend their Class 3A championship at the Georgia Dome. Two fourth-down conversions and huge plays on offense kept the game alive. The defense shut down Grady's Marcus Caffey while the Trojans' Travis Richmond came alive to lead his team to victory with 118 yards rushing and two touchdowns. After a scary victory at Grady Stadium, Peach County will now turn its attention to Sandy Creek, who has coasted through the playoffs.

The Patriots are a defending state champion as well. After moving down from Class 4A as the defending champion, Sandy Creek will now play the defending Class 3A champ. Chip Walker's team has won 27 consecutive games and will look to make that theirs the longest winning streak in the state with a win over Peach County. The Patriots have won all three playoff games thus far by outscoring opponents 133-3, their most recent a 41-0 romp over Monroe Area. This game is almost guaranteed to be a shootout and should be full of intensity.

Burke County at Carrollton

For the first time since 1997, Burke County is back in the semifinals. But it hasn't been easy for the Bears.

Burke County has squeezed by their first three playoff opponents in wins against Crisp (19-18) in the first round, Baldwin (21-20) in the second, and then a 45-20 victory over Cedar Grove in the quarterfinals.

With the Cedar Grove game tied at halftime, the Bears needed their defense to step up and their running game to get going. Led by a huge rushing attack and a strong defensive effort, Burke County came out firing and scored 23 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to defeat Cedar Grove 45-20. The Saints' inability to score on their first two red-zone possessions to open the second half left the door open for Burke County to take control of the game, which they did. The Bears will hope for a similar effort against the Carrollton Trojans tonight.

Carver-Columbus at Calhoun

Keep an eye on the undefeated Tigers if Calhoun keeps it interesting Friday night. After all, the favorites don't know all too much about close games. They beat Buford 14-0 early in the season, and have been rolling ever since. In one of the most dominant seasons in any classifications Dell McGee's bunch is scoring an incredible 37 points per game and is giving up just four per game for their opponents.

A big reason for their success is superstar running back Isaiah Crowell. The big-time recruit rushed for close to 2,000 yards in his junior season, and has been even better this time around. Just look at his performance against Thomasville last week, when he rushed for 314 yards and five touchdowns.

The Tigers do it in the run game, but Kris Carson is also a reliable force under center. Then there's that stout defense, which features a terrifying cornerback tandem in Deion Bonner and Riyadh Jones.

While their opponents excel on the ground, Calhoun can do big things in the air. Check out last week's win over Fitzgerald, when J.T. Palmer caught two passes for touchdowns. But they also have great balance offensively thanks to preseason all-state performer Dustin Christian, a talent with speed similar to Crowell's.

You don't get this far without a strong defense, and Calhoun is no exception, with junior tackling machine Alex Kirby leading a stout front seven at linebacker.

Don't expect the Jackets to be intimidated by Crowell and company. They've been here before, as they were state runners-up in 2009.

Lovett at Buford

Jess Simpson's team has already been to this party. The Wolves have turned into a dynasty under the sixth-year head coach. Just check the history – three consecutive state titles and just four losses in six seasons.

Alex Ross is solid under center. But it's been the running game that features the three-headed monster of do-it-all Dominique Swope, experienced and dangerous Seon Jones, and uber-athletic Eric Barr out of the backfield.

This team wasn't the clear favorite in AA with the presence of Carver-Columbus, especially after the Wolves' 14-0 loss to the Tigers in week 2. But they've been a dominant team since that loss, winning all their games by 23 points or more before showing they can also win ugly in last week's 21-14 victory over Cook.

The team which lost to them by those 23 points was region opponent Lovett. The upstart Lions lost 37-14 to Buford in week 4, and looked vulnerable after losing to arch-rival Westminster by the same score later in the season, and finished fourth in Region 6. But they responded from that loss by rattling off four straight wins. Now they're just one win away from playing in the Georgia Dome.

The Lions will look to control the clock with their running game. Zach Boden rushed for 135 yards in a first-round win, and then ran for an astounding 239 yards and three scores in a quarterfinal win against Brooks Co. He was a big reason for last week's win, as starting quarterback Hunter Budd was not active. Jack Geraghty filled in admirably for Budd last week, rushing for four touchdowns.

Clinch County at Wilkinson County

To say the sum is greater than the parts would not be insulting to the Clinch County Cougars because the sum adds up to the top-ranked squad in Class A. Clinch County improved to 13-0 and earned a spot in the semifinals with a 34-27 comeback win over ELCA last week thanks to two fourth-quarter touchdowns from Anthony McNeil. Last season, McNeil was the Cougars' leading rusher and he has teamed with Tray Dorsey to form a potent one-two punch out of the offensive backfield. The Cougar defense has shut down several potent offenses all season long and will look to do the same against Wilkinson County. Clinch County has some big wins on the year, having knocked off ranked opponents Wilcox County and Charlton County entering the playoffs.

Wilkinson County will need a standout performance from sophomore quarterback David Whipple, who threw a 28-yard touchdown pass and ran for a go-ahead 40-yard scoring scamper in the Warriors' 20-7 win over ECI. Before the season is over, Whipple likely will post 2,000 yards passing and 30 scores through the air. He'll have the support of Tevin Underwood at tailback, Alvin Dupree at tight end and Devontaye Drayton at wideout. Drayton has had some problems with drops this year but he was solid in the quarterfinals against ECI, hauling in one score and securing a two-point conversion. The Warriors have now advanced to the semifinals for the second time in three seasons.

Savannah Christian at Wesleyan

The Wesleyan Wolves won the Class A state title in 2008 and now sit on the verge of another championship game appearance. Several players have contributed to the team's remarkable 2010 run but senior Kyle Karempelis has been churning up mileage like no other during the playoffs. Karempelis rushed for 298 yards in a quarterfinal win over Wilcox County and had three touchdowns to spark the victory. He has over 5,000 rushing yards in his career and 92 scores, which is more than Herschel Walker had. Andrew Frerking provides senior leadership from the quarterback position and UGA-bound offensive lineman David Andrews calls the shots in the trenches.

Savannah Christian meanwhile is just one win away from returning to the Georgia Dome one season after coming up a win short of the title. The Raiders surely remember the 2009 final when they lost 30-21 to Wilcox County and will have that on their minds today. The 2010 edition features a balanced offense led by quarterback Harrison Curry, who is capable of placing the ball anywhere on the field. The running game is strong as well with Will Austin grinding out rushing yards as well as receiving yards (he ran for a 44-yard score and hauled in a touchdown reception against Lincoln County in the quarterfinals) to complement Nardo Govan and fullback Andrew Moore. The defense is also stout, allowing just one second-half first down while snagging two fourth-quarter interceptions to ice the quarterfinals victory.


